

How to Become a JMA Member Club

A MEMBER as referred to herein is a member CLUB, not any individual except when referring to individual participants as a member of the council.

A MEMBER club must have:

A designated name by which it is known and;

A minimum of five (5) individuals identified as founding constituents of such club

To Qualify as a Member Club

1. The Member must have some form of identity (logo, patch, t-shirt w/logo, etc.), which, although not specifically defined herein, the Executive Board, after soliciting comments from the Council for a period not to exceed 10 days will determine the adequacy thereof and accept or deny membership per the provisions of this section.
2. The MEMBER must have, If not a Charter or set of By-laws, a written statement defining the reason/purpose for their existence as a Jewish motorcycle club and affirmation that the club is not-for-profit. As with the requirement for identity above, these By-laws make no attempt to define the nature of the required document, but the Council will review and determine the adequacy thereof.
3. Preferably, the MEMBER should have a Jewish connection either in terms of supporting a Jewish educational or charitable entity whether it is in terms of fund raising and/or in terms of providing intellectual and physical aid. c.
4. A Chapter or similarly affiliated branch of an existing MEMBER club will automatically achieve JMA membership but cannot have a Council representative (see Section 6), participate in Council activities nor have a vote separate from that of its parent club.
 - 4.1. The Chapter or affiliate is bound by the provisions of this Charter & By-laws. The parent club (MEMBER) is responsible for any and all actions of its Chapters or affiliates.
 - 4.2. A club may become a MEMBER of the JMA by agreeing in writing to be bound by these By-laws and by remitting dues in accordance with Section 11, subject to any regulations imposed under U.S, or other law.
5. The JMA does not restrict membership on the basis of race, color, disability, sex, religion, or national origin.
